**THE FIRST SAN DIEGO KOREAN FOOD WEEK
CELEBRATION TO COME IN SEPTEMBER
Restaurants to Participate in City-Wide Celebration of Korean Cuisine**

San Diego will be experiencing its very first **Korean Food Week** celebration this coming September, in time for the Korean Thanksgiving. On this day, Koreans perform an ancestor worship ritual with an offer of food made of new crops to thank their ancestors for giving them good fortune. Similar to the American Thanksgiving, ***Chu'sok*** is the time for family to reunite and give thanks for their blessings by sharing foods and traditional drinks.
